
Vulcan Materials Company (Vulcan) has been managing the Cajon Creek Habitat  
Conservation Management Area (Conservation Area) since 1999 when it purchased

CalMat Company. The Conservation Area is managed by the Memorandum of Understanding and Implementation Agreement for the Cajon Creek Habitat Conservation Management Area (MOU). The Parties to the MOU are the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the California Department of Fish and Game and Vulcan (CalMat).

Section III.B.1. provides that the "Stated Term" for the MOU is ten years. Thus, the MOU will expire ten years after its effective date or on October 1, 2006. Section III.B.2 allows Vulcan to extend the term of the "Stated Term" at its sole discretion. As provided for in Section III.B.2., Vulcan is extending the MOU until December 31, 2025.
