## **DUTIES SUMMARY**

Under general supervision, to perform skilled hand, air and airless painting of buildings, facilities, reservoirs, equipment and furniture; and to perform other related duties as required.

## **DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS**

The class of Painter II is the journeyman level in the Painter series. Supervision is received from the Lead Painter and/or the Water Reclamation Facilities Maintenance Supervisor.

## **EXAMPLES OF DUTIES**

*The following duties are typical essential duties for positions in this classification. Any single position may not perform all of these duties and/or may perform similar related duties not listed here:*

- Provides courteous and expeditious customer service to the general public and City department staff;
- Routinely adheres to and maintains a positive attitude towards City and Department goals;
- Ensures proper use of safety equipment; wears protective apparel;
- Paints reservoirs, buildings, equipment and furniture by brush or spray;
- Sandblasts interiors of covered reservoirs;
- Removes adhesive materials from interior walls;
- Operates gas-powered water blasters;
- Paints handrails, barricades and fences;
- Applies putty and filler;
- Sets up and dismantles ventilation systems;

- Applies epoxy sealers to concrete surfaces;
- Installs roofing;
- Performs light construction duties;
- Directs the work of assigned helpers;
- Operates Department vehicles.

## **QUALIFICATIONS**

*Any combination of education, training, and experience that would likely provide the knowledge, skills, and abilities to successfully perform in the position is qualifying. A typical combination includes:*

### **Knowledge of:**

- Proper use of hand and portable power tools;
- Basic safety in working with tools;
- Basic mathematics;
- Verbal English to understand and be understood;
- Written English to communicate in writing at an intermediate level;
- Simple record keeping methods;
- Appropriate safety precautions and procedures;

### **Ability to:**

- Perform heavy physical labor;
- Read and write at a level sufficient for job success;
- Clean and maintain tools in good working order;
- Maintain records;
- Work in confined space while wearing protective clothing under conditions of extreme temperatures and toxic materials;
- Climb and work safely at heights above the ground, on ladders, scaffolds, or tower trucks;
- Operate a vehicle observing legal and defensive driving practices;
- Establish and maintain effective relationships with those contacted in the course of work;
- Maintain a driving record which meets Vehicle Code Standards and is acceptable to the Department and its insurance carrier.

## **MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS**

**Education:** Graduation from high school, or equivalent,

And

**Experience:** Two years of painting or construction and maintenance experience,

And

**Certificates:** Possession of a valid Class "C" California Motor Vehicle Operator's License. For out of state applicants, a valid Driver's License is required and a valid Class "C" California Motor Vehicle Operator's License must be obtained within ten (10) days of appointment (CA Vehicle Code 12405c).

## **NECESSARY SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS**

## **PHYSICAL TASKS AND ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS**

Work involves exposure to potential physical harm, hazardous chemicals, and infectious disease including smoke, fumes, gas, treated water, high frequency noise, dirt, dust, grease, oil, chemicals, solvents and toxic agents. Incumbents need to be able to tolerate unpleasant odors, wet conditions, and uncomfortable climatic conditions. There is frequent need to stand, sit, stoop, walk, and perform other similar actions during the course of the workday.

Incumbents require sufficient mobility to work in a field setting in varying weather conditions, to operate hand tools, to transport materials and supplies weighing up to 75 pounds and to travel to various locations. Must be able to see in the normal visual range with or without correction with vision sufficient to read small print, computer screens and other printed documents. Must be able to hear in the normal audio range with or without correction. Employee accommodations for physical or mental disabilities will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
