RE: Cultural Resources Records Search for the Lena Drive Property, San Bernardino, California

Dear Mr. LaMar:

The archaeological records search has been completed for the 15.64-acre property located at the intersection of Orange Show Road and Lena Drive in the city of San Bernardino, California. This location, also referred to as Lena Drive, was subjected to a records search at the South Central Coastal Information Center (SCCIC) at California State University, Fullerton. The records search encompassed an area within a one-mile radius of the project site.

The records search information has indicated that no recorded cultural resources are present within the property; however, 19 resources were identified within one mile of the project. These sites include three historic buildings, one historic flour mill site, three historic ditches, one historic military site, two demolished historic buildings, two historic concrete foundations, one historic railroad bridge, one historic railroad spur, one historic canal segment, one historic deposit, one historic site consisting of two concrete foundations and a concrete pond, one historic site consisting of two concrete slabs, and one historic events center. In addition, a total of 38 cultural resource studies have been conducted within a one-mile radius of the project, three of which (Chasteen 2008, 2009; Smith et. al 2008) included portions of the subject property. All three cultural resource studies were conducted for the sbX E Street Corridor BRT Project in the cities of Loma Linda and San Bernardino. While two of the studies (Smith et. al 2008; Chasteen 2009) did result in the identification of archaeological sites, none were recorded within the current project area.
