The Annual Little League Baseball and Softball Western Regional Tournaments will once again be held at the Little League Western Region Headquarters, 6707 Little League Drive in San Bernardino. The Softball Regionals will run from July 23 through July 29 and the Baseball Regionals will run from August 6-12.

The baseball tournament features all-star teams from northern and southern California, as well as Hawaii and Arizona with the winning team advancing to the Little League World Series to be held in Williamsport, PA. The



softball tournament will feature teams from California, Arizona, Hawaii, Nevada, and Utah with the winning team advancing to the Little League Softball World Series in Greenville, North Carolina.

Games will be played at Al Houghton Stadium, which is named after the first Regional Director of the Western Region who was instrumental in the building of the headquarters.

Admission and Parking are FREE for all games. However, parking is limited, so you need to plan accordingly. The gates will open approximately 30 minutes before the first game of the day.

The weather is often very hot during these tournaments, so dress appropriately. Hats and sunscreen are recommended. Remember to stay hydrated. Water, various drinks, and food will be available for purchase at the stadium, as well as a variety of Regional and Little League souvenirs.

The Civic Athletic Club All Stars, from the 6th Ward in the City's west side, are the last team from San Bernardino to be State champions and advance to the LLWS Western Regionals.

The CAC All Stars team members were Michael Adams, Paul Anderson, Harry (Teddy) Brown, Bobby Caldwell, Lynn Davis, Gary Dawson, Gerald

Jacks, John Jordan, Kevin McDowell, Kevin Mosley, Zachary Russ, Ladell Taylor, Byron Wilhite, and William (Billy) Wilson. The team was guided by manager Al Jury, league president Felton Anderson, and the late coach Leonard Davis.

In 1972, the team won twelve consecutive games and won the state championship. They were defeated in the semifinals of the western regional playoffs by Pearl City, Hawaii. The team went on to win the consolation championship of the western region tournament to finish with a record of thirteen and one.

# Norton Air Force Base Museum Highlights the 52-Year History of the Base

Looking to learn more about San Bernardino's history? Then stop by the Norton Air Force Base Museum.

The museum opened in 2013 honoring the base's history after its closure in 1994. The museum is home to San Bernardino military history dating back to the opening of the base in 1942, including displays on its name's sake, Capt. Leland Francis Norton, Chuck Yeager, the first man to break the sound barrier, Lt. Col. Kathy La Sauce who was the first female to pilot the giant C-141 cargo jet, and a POW memorial corner.

Long term, trees grown from saplings will save the City 80% in costs and enable crews to properly trim/ nurture them as they grow and to have them readily available for planting.


