## On the Cover: Festival to Celebrate the Best of San Bernardino on October 8 at Seccombe Lake

The City of San Bernardino Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department proudly presents its first Annual San Bernardino Festival: Where our Cultures Connect, at Seccombe Lake Park on Saturday, October 8, 2022 from 10:00 am to 6:00 pm.

This one-day event is focused on connecting our city through its people, its culture, and its history. Festival is a celebration of the unique cultural make-up of our great city and will include elements such as food, art, music, car shows, live demonstrations, and entertainment to embrace San Bernardino's amazing Diversity, Heritage, History, and Culture.

The Festival will feature multiple themed villages, the Animal Village featuring a petting zoo, Community Partners Village, Food Village featuring food from around the globe, Artists Village featuring local artists, Marketplace Village, and Kids Village with games and rides for the kids. Each village will provide resources, activities, and learning opportunities for families to enjoy. In addition, cultural performances and demonstrations will take place on several stages across the event.

Seccombe Lake Park is located at 160 West 5th Street in San Bernardino. Parking for this event will be located at the Carousel Mall on 2nd Street and the City Hall parking structure on D Street. Free shuttles will be operating all day.

To prepare for the Festival, Seccombe Lake Park will close to the public on September 30.

## After Ten Years, the City Exits Bankruptcy in a Strong Financial Position

On September 8, 2022, U.S. Bankruptcy Judge Scott C. Clarkson issued an order discharging the City of San Bernardino's bankruptcy case, bringing an end to a process that began over ten years ago.

"What exciting news and a moment for San Bernardino residents to celebrate," said Mayor John Valdivia. "The closure of this chapter in our history - the grueling and deep cuts we all experienced are in the rearview mirror. I wish to express my gratitude to our community along with the businesses who have stood fast with our city."

The City exits bankruptcy in a strong financial position with cash reserves exceeding \$40 million and a projected budget surplus of \$2.5 million this fiscal year. The cash reserves represent 25% of the general fund budget, a threshold indicating financial stability for a city. When San Bernardino entered bankruptcy in 2012, the city had a cash deficit of \$18.2 million and a projected \$45.8 million budget deficit.

"Our city is now pivoting to successfully re-establish and expand core services to our taxpayers and business community," added Valdivia. "The council is focused on thoughtful and focused priorities to enhance these services and I want to commend these council members on this great win for our city."

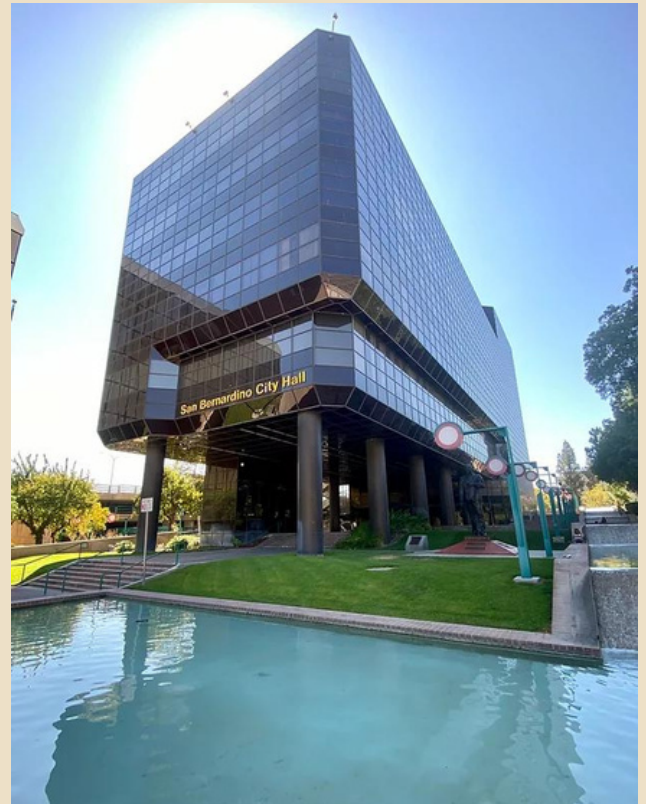
In recent months, the City has been allocating resources to repave streets, trim trees, and renovate parks and senior centers.

"Projects that for many years were deferred are now happening," said City Manager Robert Field. "Residents are noticing a difference."

San Bernardino has also been strategically hiring needed staff, including police officers and code enforcement officers. The city recently added a housing and homelessness team to work on issues related to the city's unhoused population.

"The real unsung heroes during this process were the residents of San Bernardino, added Field. "In a time of crisis, they stepped up by approving a major structural re-organization of our city government along with a local sales tax measure. The importance of those votes cannot be overstated."

Facing a dire liquidity crisis, San Bernardino filed for Chapter 9 bankruptcy protection on August 1, 2012. At the time, it was the third largest municipal bankruptcy in U.S. history.

## Median Improvements Installed on Tippecanoe

Public Works crews removed all irrigation and installed a drought tolerant median on Tippecanoe Avenue north of Hospitality Lane.

This is one of three drought-tolerant, low to zero maintenance concepts being installed on medians and street islands across the city. This is the 6th conversion this year with two more coming by the end of this year.



## San Bernardino Police Officers Rescue Three Residents Caught by Flash Flood

San Bernardino police officers Gabriel Rodriguez, Tommy Tran, and Jonathan Mason were at the right place at the right time on September 11 when heavy rains turned in to a flash flood on Waterman Avenue.

The officers, all with less than one year on the job, took action to rescue a mother and her two children who were trapped.

Things were tense for a few minutes, but everyone was able to escape the ordeal unharmed.

## Over 800 Cars Expected to be on Display at the 2022 Rendezvous Back to Route 66

The 9th Annual "Rendezvous Back to Route 66", one of the biggest (and best) car shows in Southern California will be happening on Saturday, October 1, 2022, with cruising on "E" Street returning to Downtown San Bernardino "Where It All Began" from 9:00 am to 9:00 p.m.

Organized by the San Bernardino Area Chamber of Commerce, this event will take you back to the golden era of cool cars, muscle cars, and cars that you, your parents, or your grandparents used to show off when gas was less than a dollar a gallon.



There will be great food, great music featuring the Best of Everything Band, and of course the cars!

The event borders are "E" Street to the west, 5th Street to the north, Arrowhead to the east and 2nd Street to the south. The cruise route will wind itself around and through the event area. The approved route is 2nd St to Arrowhead Ave., north to 5th, west on 5th to "E" St, to south on "E" St, east on Court St. to D St, south on D to 2nd St., and east on 2nd to Arrowhead Ave.

## Lytle Creek Community Center Hosts Golden Cobra Karate

Do you know the next Karate Kid? The Lytle Creek Community Center hosts Golden Cobra Karate every Saturday for youth between the ages of five to sixteen.

Golden Cobra Karate participants get the opportunity to learn self-defense with a blend of styles of Kenpo, Shotokan, Judo, Wrestling, Boxing, and Muay Tai.

Classes are held from 10am – 11am for ages 5 to 10; 11am – 12pm for ages 5 to 10; and 12pm – 1:45pm for ages 11 to 16. Registration is \$20/month for residents and \$25/month for non-residents.



## Center for Individual Development is Making a Difference in the Lives of Its Participants



The Center for Individual Development (CID) is a regional recreation center that focuses on providing recreation programs for people of all ages with physical, developmental and mental disabilities and is operated under the auspices of the Authority for the Handicapped. Seniors and individuals without disabilities are also welcome to participate in many of CID programs.

Currently, CID is revving up to make their way back to Disneyland! They announced their fundraising efforts in June and from there it felt like there was no stopping them. Each week a participant would update our “Disney-mometer,” thanks to either a donation from a community member, a sponsorship, or a bag of recyclables donated by a participant.

CID worked all summer to achieve this goal and on the day they finally reached the top of their Disney-mometer, Elisa Gonzales, sister to a CID participant, raised enough funds to cover participant's jackets, as well as additional funds for all 25 participants to use at their leisure when they're at the park—sounds like churros for everyone!

This marks the fourth year they were able to make it to Disneyland and every year feels like the first!

CID will be hosting a Family Day on September 19, where families get to bond over food, activities, an EPIC water battle, and a movie at dusk.

## Recent Surge has Animal Shelter Nearing Capacity



A recent influx of lost or abandoned dogs and cats has resulted in the San Bernardino Animal Shelter having too many dogs at the shelter, 192 to be exact. With only 130 kennels, that means dogs are sharing kennels or being housed in smaller spaces.

Since September 6th, the Department has brought in 90 dogs alone.

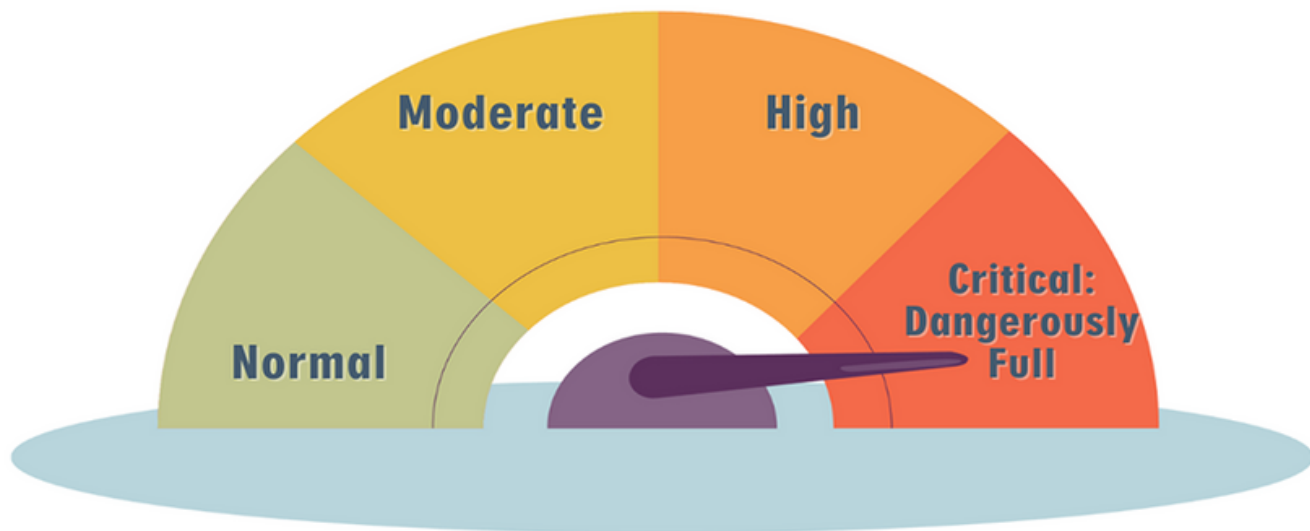
If you have lost your pet or know someone who has, please come to the shelter and pick up your lost pet. We may be able to help you with the fees to get your animal back.

If you have been thinking about adopting a dog or fostering for animal services, please come down today! Adoption fees are waived for dogs. If you would like to foster, we will give you the food and supplies to care for the pet.

If you find a lost pet who is friendly, please hold onto it for a few days or a week while you try to find the owner. You can bring it to the shelter and we will scan for a microchip and vaccinate the pet. We will also give you food and supplies to take care of the dog until the owner can be found. The pet's information will be stored in our system so if the owner comes in, we can call you to coordinate the pet's safe return.

# Senior Companion Program

## City Looking for Volunteers to Serve as Senior Companions

Since 1975, the City has participated in the federally funded Senior Companion Program, where volunteers assist senior-age residents. Most of the residents are elderly and without family. In 2021-2022, Senior Companion Volunteers provided 71 clients with 20,985 hours of service.

Senior Companion Volunteers perform valuable roles including companionship, grocery shopping, transportation to medical appointments and errands, and relief for family caregivers.



There is currently a waitlist of individuals in need of volunteer companions. Interested individuals must be at least 55 years of age, meet established income eligibility guidelines, and pass a criminal background check. Volunteers serve between 15 to 40 hours per week and receive an hourly stipend of \$3.15 per hour, as well as accidental liability and excess automobile insurance coverage, assistance with the cost of transportation, and onboarding physical examinations. In addition, the Senior Companion Volunteers benefit from having purpose and contributing to their community, and keeping active. Please see below for more information on how to volunteer.

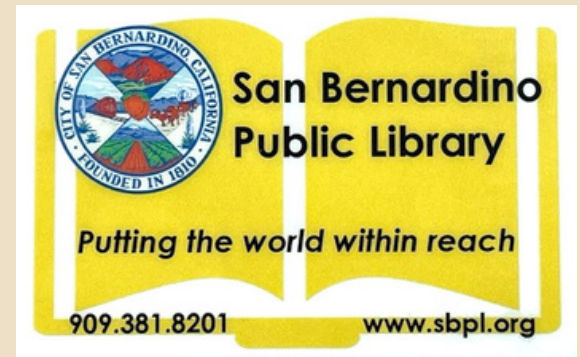

## Financial Literacy for Teens Now Part of Library Programming

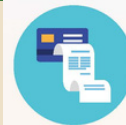
In the coming months, the Library will be expanding its educational and enrichment programming available for residents to take advantage of.
